- (i) National Specific Purpose Payments (these expenses have 'NSPP' codes): Commonwealth current grants 'to' or 'through' the States and Territories to be spent in the broad sector to which they relate (e.g. healthcare, school education, vocational education and training, disabilities services, affordable housing) on activities that would normally be regarded as the Constitutional responsibility of the States and Territories. Within each broad sector, the States and Territories have discretion on how they spend Commonwealth national SPP funding, including allocations between current and capital expenses.
- (ii) National partnership (NP) payments (these expenses have 'SPP' codes): Commonwealth current or capital grants 'to' or 'through' the States and Territories to support the delivery of specific projects, to facilitate national reforms or to reward jurisdictions that deliver on national reforms in areas that would normally be regarded as the Constitutional responsibility of the States and Territories. NPs have specific conditions on how Commonwealth funds can be spent by the States and Territories and often involve specific funding contributions from the States and Territories. Nearly all new items created will be in this category.
- (iii) Local Government Assistance (these expenses have 'LGA' codes): Current or capital grants direct to local government (which does not exist as a separate entity under the Australian Constitution and is therefore legally part of State and Territory jurisdictions). These grants are also expenses from the Commonwealth's perspective.
- (iv) Loans to state and territory governments Advances (these assets have 'ADV' codes): Advances made from the Commonwealth to state or territory governments.
- (v) Loans to state and territory governments Repayments (these contra assets have 'REP' codes: Repayments made by states or territory governments in relation to advances received from the Commonwealth.
- (vi) Interest from state and territory government loans (these revenues have 'INT' codes): Interest received from state or territory governments in relation to advances received from the Commonwealth.

For example, grants for road funding will be classified as capital reflecting the ultimate use of the funds even though the grant will be an expense from the perspective of the Commonwealth.
