Report on activities & achievements, lessons learnt & alternative approaches & key outcomes

ACTIVITY #1: EMERGING DEMOCRACIES PROGRAM (2017 -2018)

The program continued to consolidate and progress the work ALI has been conducting with political parties and organisations in recent years and progressed the development of new relationships with emerging democracies in the Asian Pacific region. Opportunities to strengthen capacity and build on knowledge sharing were developed with a view to promote democracy and democratic parties and organisations.

In country activities conducted included:

MYANMAR National League for Democracy	Assistance and participation in training event and workshop in February 2018.
PAPUA NEW GUINEA Integrity of Political Parties and Candidates Commission (IPPCC)	Conducted a post-election diagnostic workshop with PNG political parties in October 2017 with an aim to strengthen the democracy building work of the IPPCC. Design and delivery of Train the Trainer course in June 2018, in collaboration with the IPPCC.
INDONESIA PDI-P Nasdem	Visit by nine delegates to meet and exchange information with party officials, members of the Indonesian Parliament and their advisers, Union representatives, NGOs, Embassy officials and party activists in March 2018.
MALAYSIA Democratic Action Party	Design and delivery of bespoke training prior to the election in April 2018, in collaboration with the UK Labour Party.
MONGOLIA Mongolian People's Party	Hosting two observers in Australia during the South Australian State election and the Batman by election in April 2018.
INDIA Association for Democratic Socialism	Visit to India in June 2018 by nine delegates to meet with representatives of government and social democratic parties and organisations and to discuss future opportunities for knowledge sharing and training opportunities and develop an understanding of Indian political systems and institutions.

Implementation Progress Report 2017-2018

ACTIVITY #2: KURT STEEL CAMPAIGN EXCHANGE PROGRAM (2017 -2018)

The aim of this program is to strengthen bilateral links with progressive, social democratic and labour parties and to connect skilled individuals from these parties with their colleagues on an international basis to further the dissemination of best-practice processes and skills in party building, management and campaigning.

The 2017-2018 period allowed ALI to build on key fraternal party relationships and to consolidate and progress the work that has been conducted over previous years with progressive, social democratic and labour parties in advanced democracies.

Activities conducted included:

NEW ZEALAND New Zealand Labor Party	Three visits to New Zealand for cooperative work with New Zealand Labor Party on developing capacity building within the party, resources and in political communication. Observation of the New Zealand election by seven participants from Australian Labor Party.
UNITED KINGDOM UK Labour Party	Attendance at the UK Labour Party Conference by three delegates in September 2017.
UNITED STATES US Democrats	Visits to the USA by five delegates in October 2017 to research and observe the latest in data and research technology. Attendance at Cybersecurity conference by one delegate in March 2018.
PROGRESSIVE ALLIANCE	Attendance and participation at four Progressive Alliance meetings and missions by ALP representatives during 2017-2018.
GLOBAL PROGRESS	Attendance and participation at two Global Progress meetings and conferences.
INTERNATIONAL UNION OF SOCIALIST YOUTH (IUSY)	Attendance at annual IUSY Congress by one delegate.
DIGITAL CONFERENCES HOSTED BY ALP	Facilitation of attendance at conferences by four international delegates.

The International Progressive Campaign Forum provides a space for

It also creates a culture of greater sharing and contact between participating parties outside of the Forum and the creation and dissemination of best-practice processes and skills in party building and management and campaigning.
The fifth International Progressive Campaign Forum was hosted by ALI in Sydney in February 2018 with participants from Argentina, Israel, New Zealand, Scotland, UK, USA, Canada, Italy and the Netherlands.
In May 2018, ALI hosted a second IPCF in collaboration with the Party of European Socialists in Brussels.
Attendees at the Brussels Forum included participants from Australia, Netherlands, Spain, USA, Canada, Denmark, Hungary, Ireland, New Zealand, Norway, UK, Switzerland and Germany.
