<p>D. <p>D. Security and Safety</p> <p>D.1 When accessing any Commonwealth place, area or facility, the Supplier must comply with any security and safety requirements notified to the Supplier by the Lead Customer or of which the Supplier is, or should reasonably be aware. The Supplier must ensure that its officers, employees, agents and Subcontractors are aware of, and comply with, such security and safety requirements.</p> <p>D.2 The Supplier should note that its officers, employees, agents and Subcontractors are generally required to undertake a Security briefing prior to being able to work inside a Commonwealth office, area or facility.</p> <p>D.3 The Supplier must ensure that all information, material and property provided by a Lead Customer is protected at all times from unauthorised access, use by an unauthorised third party, misuse, damage and destruction and is returned as directed by the Lead Customer. The Supplier acknowledges that unauthorised disclosure of security-classified information is an offence. Legislation including, but not limited to, the Crimes Act 1914 <u>Criminal Code Act 1995</u> (Cth) contains provisions relating to the protection of prescribed official <u>certain</u> information and sets out the penalties for the unauthorised disclosure of that information.</p>
